Training Objectives

Case Planning

Workers will be able to:

- Identify the stage of case planning for each family in their caseload.
- Identify appropriate case activities for each family in their caseload based upon the stage of case planning.

Assessment and Reassessment

Workers will be able to:

- Review previous assessments in the record, assess whether casework addresses the identified issues, and assess progress toward goals.
- Complete safety and risk reassessments using appropriate interviewing skills to gather the necessary information.
- Consider accumulation of harm due to chronic neglect in assessments and reassessments.
- Demonstrate knowledge of when to close a case
- Utilize the Strengths/Needs/Culture Assessment.
- Identify functional family strengths

Safety Planning

Through the use of case examples and skill practice, workers will be able to:

- Help a family plan for the safety of their children.
- Explain their role during a child abuse investigation and identify when policy requires them to make a child abuse report.

Treatment Planning

Using case examples, practice exercises, and actual case discussions, workers will be able to:

- Tie treatment plans to the assessment,
- Utilize solution-focused techniques to help families develop well-formed goals
- Revise treatment plans according to family needs and effectively use community supports through the family support teams to aid the family in reaching their goals.
- Use functional strengths in the development of mutually agreed upon solution-focused treatment plans.
- Help the family make a smooth transition from agency involvement at case closure.

Family Support Teams

Using skill practice and case examples, workers will be able to:

- Explain the purpose and roles of a Family Support Team for intact families.
- Identify key times in a family's life when a FST would be appropriate.
- Explain how to facilitate a productive meeting including addressing sensitive issues (domestic violence, hygiene, substance abuse) using engaging skills and interview techniques such as solution focused questions.
